History of the Eastern Classic

Never has a duckpin bowling tournament achieved greater success than the Frank Barber Memorial Eastern Duckpin Classic. This event holds the distinction of the longest continuous major tournament in duckpin history. This year marks the 94th annual classic event.


It was during the late 1920s and early 1930s that Frank Barber and George Iseman (then secretary of the National Duckpin Bowling Congress) arranged many intersectional bowling match games involving the top rated bowlers from Connecticut and those from the Baltimore/Washington D.C. area to bowl in team, doubles and singles competition in front of large crowds. These match-ups brought about a new image to the duckpin bowling game, It was such that Frank Barber has a vision to bring these bowling greats from the north and south to bowl individually to compete in a 15 game (three 5 game sets) total pinfall for a guaranteed prize list. Thus the birth of the Eastern.

As the tournament grew in popularity, the format had to be changed on a number of occasions. In the early years, several well known dignitaries made their appearance, among them Lou Gerhig, famous New York Yankee baseball great, and "lefty" Dugas former Philadelphia Phillies pitcher, whose brother Fred "Babe" Dugas, was the youngest bowler to win the Eastern in 1932.

In the year 1969 the tournament set an all time entry of 388 bowlers. The prize list totaled over \$7,500.00 with 154 prizes. It was Barber's desire to give the participating bowler, regardless of his bowling average, an opportunity to place in the money list and to gain individual merits as well. Efforts to achieve a 400 entry had been a goal for several years much to the effort of Edward Feustal of New Haven, CT (former secretary of NDBC) who worked hand in hand with Barber to reach that goal. That was not to be, for Feustal passed away in 1972, and Barber died in 1973. The Dunnack Family and the staff at Lucky Strike Lanes continue to strive to make this tournament a major duckpin bowling attraction.
